Evervone needs "a Round Tu-it." The leper's we heard about today probably meant to thank Jesus. Excited about being cured, they did not get 'around-to-it.' We get caught up in our own interests and fail to appreciate what we have or to say what is in our Ψ s. This week get yourself "a round tu-it."

A Great Privilege (Part I)

From the beginning of His life on earth, Jesus wanted it to be known that one of His main functions was to give us sustenance for life. Everything about Him - from the place He was born to the prayer He taught us, the miracles He performed, and His teachings to us - coalesce to show us He is the Master of the household bread supply - He is the Lord - He is the Food-Provider. His whole mission is to sustain us unto eternal life.

About one year before Holy Thursday, when He instituted the Sacrament of the Eucharist at the Last Supper on the night before He died. He was already prophesying that He would catapult us into eternal life through the redemptive act of Calvary, and that a few hours before doing so, He would consecrate the bread that was His very flesh to sustain us here on earth.

The last act of His life on earth before His death was in itself a kind of "preview" of that sacrificial, redemptive act, for that body "given" would also be "given up." Similarly, His blood, which would be shed the following day "on behalf of many," was presented at the Last Supper as the "cup of salvation" (Psalm 116:13)
