Catholic Home Missions News

The Catholic Home Missions collection addresses challenges here in the States. A critical need was met in the Diocese of Helena in Montana:

Madison County (two parishes within its 3,600 square miles) had no resident priest or even a visiting priest living there. A grant funded by the collection enabled the Diocese to cover costs for a priest to travel 160 miles a week to celebrate Mass as well as provide Eucharist in care centers & homes.

The faith of the people of Madison County has blossomed with having Mass every Sunday with the same priest. There also has been an increase in Mass attendance as well as at bible studies and religious education classes. They feel that the larger Church recognized and made them feel important enough to provide a priest for them.

Thank you for your support which provides grants for needy dioceses.
