New Year's Meditation from Magnificat

How easy it is to dismiss God when we think He is too distant or aloof in our life. How impatient and impetuous we are in this regard, but Simeon lived only to regard the Messiah. (Luke 2:25-31)

The peace of his aged soul came from assenting to God's promise. Nothing less could console him, for Simeon lived without a shred of compromise or vanity. He surrendered himself fully to God's Word.

In the darkness of the night we await our Bridegroom, like the five wise and five foolish virgins. We do not fear that our lamps will run dry, for we come filled with the oil of divine Wisdom. We recognize the foolishness of attempting to live by our own ideas and opinions - - our own false enlightenment. We carry with us the light of the Truth.

It is so easy to give in to despair when God's ways fail to be our way. Like the lame man who lay by the Sheep Pool 38 years waiting for his chance to be the first to get into the stirred-up water, we lose hope of ever being healed. We become despondent thinking that the trials and anguish of our life will never change. And yet, Jesus comes to that man, not to lift him up, but to fill him with the strength to rise, pick up his mat, and walk.
