The Baptism of the Lord

This ... is the mystery of baptism: God desired to save us by going to the bottom of this abyss Himself so that every person, even those who have fallen so low that they can no longer perceive heaven, may find God's hand to cling to and rise from the darkness to see once again the light for which he or she was made.

Jesus' first public act ... was to go down into the Jordan, mingling among repentant sinners, in order to receive this baptism... Why, therefore, did the Father desire this? Was it because He had sent His only-begotten Son into the world as the Lamb to take upon Himself the sins of the world (Jn 1:29)? The Evangelist recounts that when Jesus emerged from the waters, the Holy Spirit descended upon Him in the form of a dove, while the Father's voice from heaven proclaimed Him "my beloved Son in whom I am well pleased." (Mt 3:17) From that very moment, therefore, Jesus was revealed as the one who came to baptize humanity in the Holy Spirit: He came to give men and women life in abundance, eternal life, which brings the human being back to life, and heals him entirely, in body and in spirit, restoring him to the original plan for which he was created.
